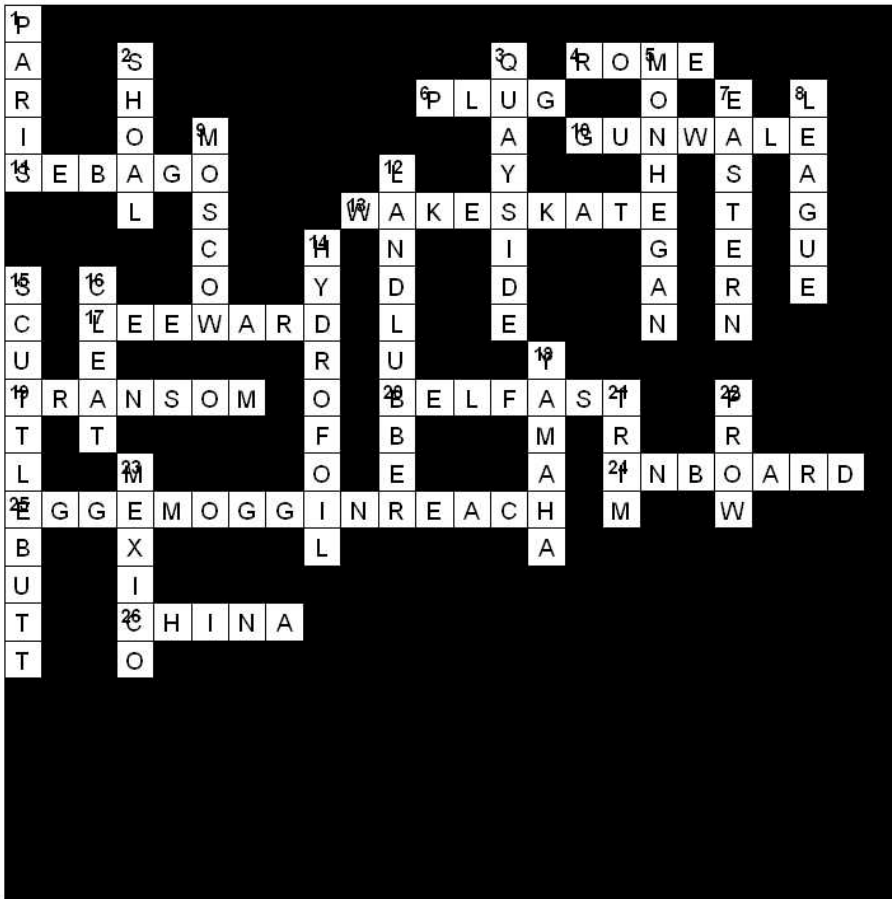


Winter 2008 Crossword Puzzle
